**Free Training Seminar for Law Enforcement on Fighting
Cyber Crime to be Held in Tarrytown, N.Y.**

RICHMOND, VA –The National White Collar Crime Center (NW3C) will host a free training seminar in Tarrytown, N.Y. for local, state, federal, and international law enforcement agencies; regulatory agencies; prosecution agencies; and institutions involved in the investigation, apprehension, prevention, or prosecution of economic and cyber crimes from across the country. The April 18, 2007 event, entitled “Electronic Law Enforcement”, is co-sponsored by the Westchester County District Attorney’s Office and the Westchester County Department of Public Safety. Law enforcement representatives attending the event will gain insight and investigative skills for the latest economic and cyber crime methods.
